 A Detailed Analysis of the Strategic, Public Order Threats and Risks in Ireland is Absent.

 The Governance of Public Order Policing is Spread Across Multiple Functions and Individuals.

 There is a Lack of Transparency, Governance and Oversight in relation to Public Order and Garda Use of Force.

### **Capacity and Capability**



 Current Public Order Capacity is Based on a Historical Requirement.

- Inconsistent Selection Practices for the National Public Order Unit.
- Low Level of Female Representation.

 No Mandatory Recertification Process for Public Order Commanders.

#### **Operational Delivery**



 Public Order Commanders and Event Planners have Limited Access to Human Rights Advice.

 A Structured Approach to Community Engagement is not Part of the Planning Process.

 Lack of Consistency in the Authorisation of National Public Order Unit.

#### **Post Incident Management**



Organisational Learning is an Ad Hoc Process.

Welfare Support is not Embedded in the Planning Process.
