## 2. Actions and matters of note

- 2.1. The Committee noted the progress made in the updated Policing Plan 2017 and welcomed the fact that feedback from the Authority has been taken on board.
- 2.2. Minutes of the Committee meeting of 14 July 2016 were agreed.
- 2.3. It was agreed that the Chief Executive of the Authority would meet with Deputy Commissioner Ó Cualáin, and the Head of the Garda Analyst Service to discuss the development of specific measures in relation to the integrity of crime statistics.
- 2.4. It was agreed that an executive summary of the Policing Plan 2017 would be prepared.
- 2.5. The Head of the Garda Analyst Service will revert to the Authority regarding the inclusion of additional questions in future Public Attitudes Surveys.
- 2.6. The Garda Síochána will forward to the Authority the latest Public Attitudes Survey results once available.

- 2.7. The Authority will consider the structure of the Garda Síochána annual reports and revert to the Garda representatives once this has been considered.
- 2.8. It was agreed that the representatives of the Authority and the Garda Síochána will meet shortly regarding further amendments to the Policing Plan 2017 as discussed at the meeting.
