# 2. Garda Síochána Operating Model

Members were presented with an overview of the new Garda Síochána ('GS') operating model which is close to being finalised, followed by a discussion on the development and plans for implementation, including in relation to:

- How the model was developed;
- Finalisation of the Headquarter structure after which a summary document will be available;
- Proactive engagement by the Commissioner and the implementation team with staff around the country and communication of the model in the organisation;
- External communications to explain benefits to the public;
- Approach to implementation, noting that the change to 4 Regions is already in place;
- Plan, logistics and timeline for phased implementation of 19 Divisions and enabling changes;
- Role of national units in developing policy and providing support to the regions;
- Role of Garda HQ and plans for delivery of range of other HQ services;
- Role of Administrative hubs and need to put administrative managers in place;
- Need to have accountability in addition to divisional autonomy;

- The proposed size and structure of the Senior Leadership team;
- Training and other supports being offered to assist in managing change and the importance of individual performance management and development in this context;

Members welcomed the approach with its focus on delivery of front line policing service to the community and offered their support to the Commissioner in helping to implement this ambitious and demanding reform.

The Authority advised the Commissioner that the model would be discussed further at the Authority meeting in public on 26 September. The Commissioner was also advised of the Authority's planned engagement with the Chairpersons of JPCs in October and invited him to take this opportunity to speak about the new operating model.
