RECORD OF MEETINGS HELD IN 2022 AND LIST OF MEMBERS

In accordance with a resolution adopted by the member of Offaly County Council, all meetings of the Council and its sub-committees continued during 2022 using a hybrid model, with some attendees having the option of attending a meeting in-person or remotely. The JPC held 4 meetings in 2022 using the hybrid model. No Public Meeting of the JPC was held in 2022.

The JPC extended an invitation to Garda Commissioner, Drew Harris to attend a meeting, which he accepted. He attended the first JPC meeting of 2022, held on 28th February 2022.

Ashling Murphy lost her life in a random attack in the afternoon of 12th January 2022, as she jogged along the Grand Canal Greenway, near Tullamore. The local communities in Tullamore, County Offaly and across Ireland were shocked and dismayed to hear of the murder. In responding to these events the Members adopted a Motion at the February meeting of the County Council which called on the Council to "undertake a study of women and girl's safety in the public realm in order to identify the factors that make women and girls and other genders at risk of gender based violence, feel safe and unsafe in public spaces in County Offaly". It was agreed that this study would be undertaken by JPC.

At its February meeting the JPC established a sub-Group to conduct this study. The sub-Group comprised of 2 members of the PPN, 2 representatives of an Garda Síochána, 2 elected Members and a senior official of Offaly County Council. The sub-Group ensured it was gender balanced. Following a number of meetings, the sub-Group agreed to conduct an online survey to gauge public opinion in relation to Safety in public spaces in Offaly, to run during July 2022. In June 2022, the Group arranged an Offaly Safety Day with further survey's being conducted with members of the public. The sub-Group held further stakeholder consultation with representatives of the Offaly Domestic Violence Support Service (ODVSS), the Midlands LGBTQ+, Childrens and Young Peoples Service Committee (CYPSC), Offaly Traveller Movement (OTM) and Tullamore Rape Crisis Centre (TRCC) in October. A Report and Recommendations based on the sub-Groups findings was prepared and presented to the JPC at its meeting held in December.
