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## 1. Introduction

The South Dublin County Joint Policing Committee was established on the 26<sup>th</sup> October 2007. The Committee continues to provide a forum for representatives from An Garda Síochána, South Dublin County Council, Oireachtas members and Community representatives, to make an important contribution to addressing issues relating to crime locally, to get together in a regular and structured way, to consult with each other and to discuss and make recommendations on matters affecting the policing of South Dublin County.

The Joint Policing Committee is a partnership, co-operative in nature and operating with the minimum of formality to identify, raise awareness of and find solutions to issues impacting on, or causing concerns for the local community.

South Dublin Joint Policing Committee continues to be a partnership between An Garda Síochána, South Dublin County Council and the residents of South Dublin County. Members of the Joint Policing Committee work together to help prevent crime and solve neighborhood problems by:

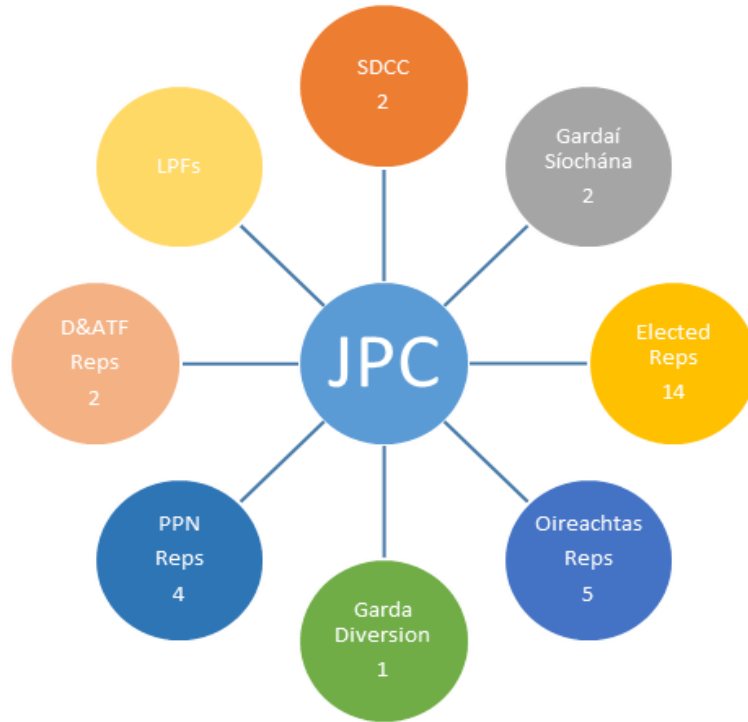
- Encouraging active citizen involvement in policing efforts.
- Focusing on issues of ongoing public concern.
- Providing continuity of service to the community.
- Ensuring active involvement by the relevant staff in problem-solving.
- Initiate creative responses to neighborhood problems.
- Developing the capacity of residents and affording them the opportunity to speak and act effectively on their own behalf.
- Strengthening and building groups and organizations so residents can advocate for their own interests.
- The work of the LPF Management Committees and LPF Public Meetings convened by the four Local Policing Fora and their role and reporting relationship to the Joint Policing Committee increases community involvement and trust in the work of the committee.



**2. Joint Policing Committee Structure**

- Dublin Metropolitan Region West

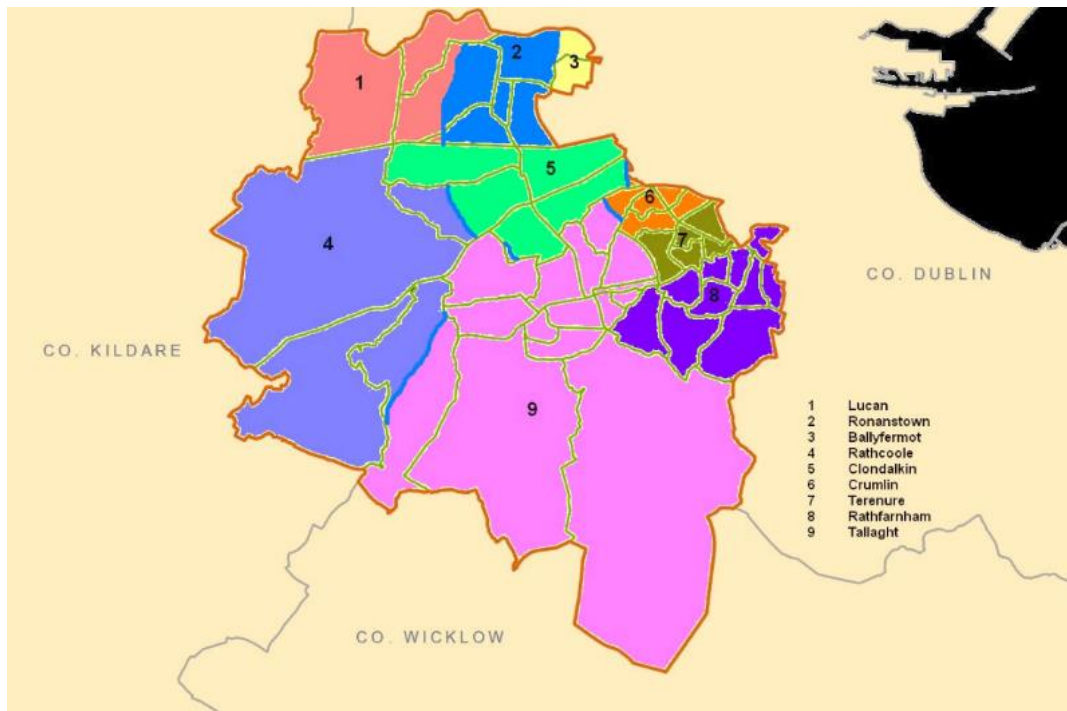

## 6. Joint Policing Committee Strategic Plan

At the Joint Policing Committee meeting held on the 24<sup>th</sup> November 2017 the Strategic Plan for 2016-2022 was agreed. The Plan links to other plans and strategies including An Garda Síochána Annual Policing Plan and South Dublin County Local Economic & Community Plan (LECP) 2016-2021.

Other Plans considered were:

- A Safer Community: South Dublin County Council Road Safety Plan 2016-2020 (published August 2016)
- Clondalkin Drug and Alcohol Task Force Strategic Plan 2018 - 2025 Reclaiming Community Development as an Effective Response to Drug Harms, Policy Harms, Poverty and Inequality was agreed in 2018.
- Tallaght Drug and Alcohol Task Force Strategic Plan 2017 - 2020 was designed and developed as an interagency collaboration, and our vision is to continue this interagency collaboration in the implementation of this strategy. Three strategic themes shaped the plan:
  - Improved service user and community outcomes
  - Effective partnership
  - Increased capacity

A “Framework Policy for Local and Community Development in Ireland was approved by Government in December 2015 and is an overarching high-level vision for the State’s engagement with the local and community development sectors. Joint Policing Committees are identified within the following objectives as having a role:

- Objective 2: Working with partners:
  - pursue an integrated “whole government” approach at central and local levels.
- Objective 3: Planning for Local and Community Development:
  - Support an integrated, coherent approach through the County Local Economic and Community Plan that is adaptable to changing needs and which clearly identify the outcomes they aim to achieve.

- Ensure priorities, as set out in the relevant Local Economic and Community Plan for expenditure at local level across all community and local development programmes are based on appropriate needs analysis and matched to available resources.
- Objective 4: Delivery
  - Through the County Local Economic and Community Plan. Deliver an integrated approach to economic development and community development at local level within the local authority area.
  - Through the County Local Economic and Community Plan, manage the delivery of interventions that provide positive action programmes targeting those groups that are most marginalised, and support them to become involved in issues and concerns affecting themselves and their communities.

A Memorandum of Understanding between the Joint Policing Committee and the Local Community Development Committee was drafted in 2017 and agreed at the first Joint Policing Committee meeting in 2018.

In South Dublin County, the Gardaí and the Local Authority have a good working relationship. Contact is made both at Senior Level, through The Joint Policing Committee and other inter-agency committees and also at operational level with the Community and Housing Departments and the Community and Juvenile Liaison Sections of the Gardaí.

**8. JPC Drugs Subcommittee**

Following the seminar in May 2016 at the Joint Policing Committee meeting held on the 25<sup>th</sup> November 2016 it was agreed to form a Drug Subcommittee which comprised the following members and met four times in 2022.

The JPC Drugs Subcommittee presented a report at the Joint Policing Committee in April 2022 outlining the need for support for families who are struggling with drug debt intimidation within the County. The Joint Policing Committee agreed to fund a pilot scheme which would help support families make minor changes as needed such as:

- Reinforced glass for windows may be needed.
- Removal of letterboxes on the front doors and replace them with exterior letterboxes that are sealed and have a private key.
- Fire blanket essential for all exits
- Fire extinguishers
- Alarm systems with an in-house monitoring system attached.
- Doorbells with cameras linked with CCTV.
- Fob keys for every room
- Reinforced hall doors
- New locks for side gates
- Panic button linked to the local Garda station.
- Bollards were secured at the end of the driveway to avoid theft.
- These precautions may not be needed for all cases, and a family may need only one or two of these security measures.

#### **9. An Garda Síochána Late Night Leagues**

The late-night leagues have been very successful throughout the County. The initiative is based around the concept of using football as a tool for social inclusion and learning, divert youths from crime and anti-social behaviour and encouraging at risk young people to participate in meaningful activities, thus reducing anti-social behaviour.

#### **10. Local Policing Fora and Public Meetings**

South Dublin County Joint Policing Committee administer three Local Policing Fora Committees:

- West Tallaght Community Safety Forum.
- Clondalkin Local Policing Forum.
- North Clondalkin, Palmerstown and Lucan Local Policing Forum.

Due DMR boundaries a portion of South Dublin County Council's area is included in D12's Local Policing Forum remit. Representatives from South Dublin County Council attend Dublin 12 LPF meetings.

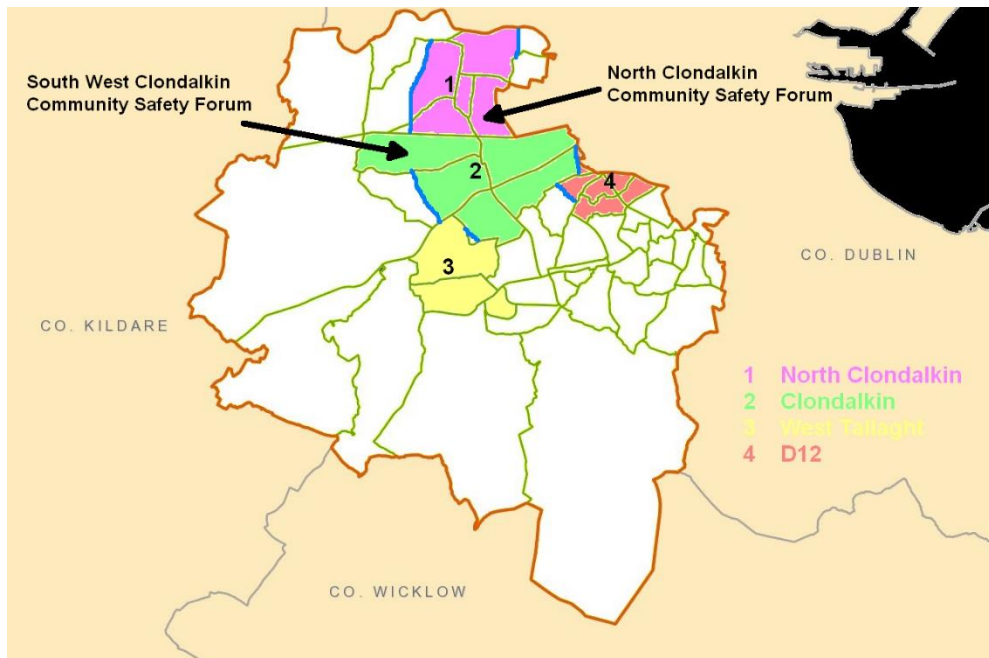
On the 6<sup>th</sup> April 2022, An Garda Síochána and South Dublin County Council held a Public Local Policing Forum in Rathcoole Community Centre.

Local Policing Fora provide a mechanism through which members of the community and various stakeholders can raise issues directly with senior members of An Garda Síochána, Elected Members and senior managers of the Local Authority. Local Policing Fora help improve communication, share appropriate information and identify issues in relation to policing, anti-social behaviour and estate management.

They work together to find solutions to issues raised, report on progress and develop guidelines to manage difficulties that arise.

The Local Policing Fora report to the Joint Policing Committee at each meeting and can advise the County Council and the Gardai on how to best perform their functions having regard to the need to do everything feasible to improve the safety and quality of life and to prevent crime, disorder, and anti-social behaviour within the area.

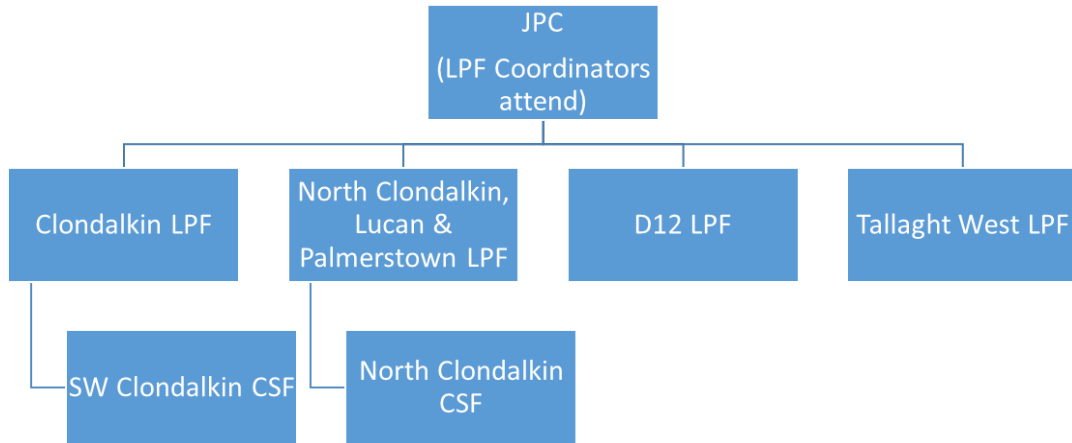
