More information about this project:

This research project is designed to understand the experiences of victims of crime in respect of their interactions with the Garda Síochána, and the impact of this interaction.

The first phase of the project consisted of desk-based research and interviews with experts in academia and the Garda Síochána. An interim report on the first phase was published in October 2020.

The second phase commenced in January 2021. The research that is being undertaken within phase two includes:

- An online survey to be completed by victims of crime residing in Ireland. The online survey includes a series of questions that will take approximately 10-25 minutes to complete
- In person or virtual interviews with victims of crime residing in Ireland. Interviews will last a maximum of one hour and will be conducted by a member of Trilateral's research team virtually or in a location agreed with the interviewee

As well as this, in January and February 2021 Trilateral Research conducted **focus groups with organisations in Ireland** that have direct interaction with victims of crime, including victims from vulnerable and marginalised communities. Click <u>here</u> for more information.
