Westmeath Joint Policing Committee Annual Report





Introduction:

Westmeath Joint Policing Committee (JPC) is a partnership between Westmeath County Council, An Garda Síochána and the Community. The membership comprises of senior Local Authority Officers, senior Garda Officers, Elected Representatives, Oireachtas Members and Representatives of Community & Voluntary groups.

The Westmeath Joint Policing Committee is intended to be a forum for discussion and a means of building confidence, trust and safety in the county. In doing this, the Westmeath JPC seeks to prioritise key community policing policy issues and identify initiatives which will contribute to improved community policing, prevention and reduction of future crime in County Westmeath.

Role of the Joint Policing Committee:

The Purpose of the Joint Policing Committee (JPC):

As set out in Section 36 (2) of the Garda Siochána Act 2005, and the amendments to this Act in 2014, the main purpose of the JPC is to provide a forum where the Local Authority and Garda, responsible for policing the area, consult with Oireachtas Members and community interests who can make recommendations on matters affecting the policing of the area to contribute to the improved safety and quality of life of the community.

Strategic Approach:

In accordance with national JPC guidelines the focus of the JPC's work is "strategic" rather than "operational". The JPC is required to develop a six year Strategic Plan linked appropriately with the Local and Economic Community Plan for the area. County Westmeath JPC adopted its Strategic Work Plan 2015 – 2020 in April 2015. The plan sets out five strategic goals:

- 1) Inclusive Consultation
- 2) Community Policing
- 3) Crime prevention and victim support
- 4) Public Safety
- 5) Road Safety

A number of objectives and actions are linked to each goal.

Membership of JPC:

Each JPC is made up of:

- Chairperson Local Authority Representative
- Garda Officers nominated by the Commissioner
- Local Authority Representatives
- Members of the Oireachtas for the area.
- Local Authority Officials
- Community / Voluntary Sector Representatives

Item No. 1:

Summary of Progress in implementing the JPC's Work Programme:

- The Chief Superintendent, Mr Peter Duff at each of the Westmeath JPC Meetings presented an overview of the key policing priorities for the Westmeath Divisions, including quarterly crime analysis, crime prevention, national and international security, community policing measures and organisational development and capacity improvement.
- Road Safety: The JPC received a presentation on Road Safety at our January 2018
 JPC Meeting where Mr Colm Smith, Road Safety Officer for Westmeath County

- Council presented the "Westmeath Road Safety Action Plan 2016-2020" to the Members.
- **Criminal Assets Bureau**: The JPC received a presentation by Chief Superintendent Patrick Clavin on the operation of the CAB.
- PPN Report: Following consultation with the JPC Members and the Community Representatives on the JPC it was agreed that a "PPN Report" would be listed as a standing JPC Agenda Item going forward.

Item No. 2:

Key achievements of the JPC during the year:

1. Regular engagement and communication with An Garda Síochána in Westmeath Division (encompassing Athlone and Mullingar Districts) regarding crime analysis, crime prevention and community policing in the County.

2. Westmeath Public Participation Network -
