Wicklow County Council JPC – Inaugural Meeting

Following the local elections in June, 2014 the Wicklow County Council Joint Policing Committee held the inaugural meeting of the new committee on the 8th of December, 2014.

Election of Chair and Vice Chair.

The first business of the meeting was the election of the Chair and Vice Chair of the Committee. Councillor Jim Ruttle was elected Chair and Councillor Irene Winters vice—chair.

Operating Guidelines

Revised Guidelines for Joint Policing Committees issued by the Department of Justice and Equality, dated the 29th August, 2014 were circulated to the committee and the following requirements were noted:-

- 1. The committee will operate at County level, following the abolition of the 4 Town Councils
- 2. The preparation of a six year Strategic Work Plan
- 3. The preparation of annual work plans
- 4. The submission of an Annual Report (no later than 3 months after the end of each year).
- 5. The requirement to put in place a communications strategy

Establishment of the JPC Steering Group

The JPC steering group is established comprising, Councillor Jim Ruttle, Chair, Chief Superintendent John P. Quirke and Lorraine Gallagher, Senior Executive Officer, Wicklow County Council (Chief Executive's nominee).

Adoption of the Wicklow County Council Joint Policing committee Six Year Strategic Plan 2016-2021

Wicklow County Council adopted the WCC Joint Policing Committee Six Year Strategic plan, 2016 - 2021 at Council meeting held on the 3rd of October, 2016 which was formally launched at a public meeting held in Roundwood on the evening of the 2nd of November, 2016. The Plan was prepared so that the Joint Policing Committee takes a genuine strategic and collaborate approach to policing issues in County Wicklow and to strengthen the strategic alignment of JPCs with other relevant County Plans and structures.

Four key themes are identified within the Plan which will form the key objectives for the JPC's annual work plan for 2017.

The key thematic areas identified are:

- (1) Policing Communities
- (2) Tackling Crime in Rural Areas;
- (3) Drug Prevention
- (4) Communications.

The four priority strategic objectives were compiled following a wide stakeholder consultation session held on the 4th of March, 2016 and from the issues raised at public meetings of the JPC held at various locations throughout county Wicklow since the Committees inception.

ITEM 2. – Highlight three key achievements of the JPC during the year and give reasons why these are considered to be significant

1. Holding of the Stake Holders Workshop in the preparation of the Wicklow County Council JPC Six Year Strategic Plan, 2016 – 2021

The holding of the stakeholder's workshop as part of the consultation process was a very effective means of bringing the work of the committee closer to the community groups and wider sector stake holders. It was very well attended with some 53 persons present indicating the level of interested sectors from all over the County. The workshop discussion was informal. Engagement and participation was enhanced by round table discussion forums. The identification of objectives and key issues to inform the Plan were achieved.

2. Setting up of the 4 working groups

The setting up of the four working groups to advance the activities of the JPC and roll out the agreed key objectives within the Plan was identified as a step to achieve successful implementation of the 6 year strategic plan. The

identification of Chairs to oversee the committee work, the support of An Garda Siochana, representatives from Wicklow County Council and the community sector is key to the success of the groups in implementing and reporting on the annual work plans.

3. Holding of public meetings

The holding of public meetings by the JPC in various locations throughout County Wicklow are seen as key to bringing the work of the committee closer to the community. A public meeting of the JPC was held in Roundwood on the 2nd of November, 2016 and was very well attended. Organisations such as the Wicklow Cheviot Sheep Owners Association, the IFA, Munitir na Tire, as well as The Pure Mile project were represented. The Superintendent for the Area made a power point presentation on relevant matters and among the issues raised and discussed were: Illegal substances, Illegal Dumping, Attacks by roaming dogs, Weekend cyclists and dangers raised, Alert Alarms for Older People living on the own, crimes in rural areas and speeding cars.

An Garda Siochana Youth Awards 2016

The Wicklow Garda Youth Awards 2016 were launched on the 10th of October, 2016. This initiative recognises the great work being carried out by young people in many communities throughout County Wicklow and is something that An Garda Siochana want to acknowledge, recognise and reward through the Garda Youth Awards. The 2016 Awards was sponsored by the Wicklow County Partnership and is identified in the 6 year Strategic Plan as a strategic priority objective.

The Wicklow County Council Joint Policing Committee congratulates An Garda Siochana for this fantastic initiative and looks forward to its continued success into the future.
